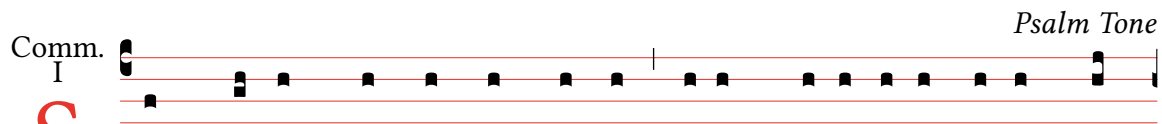

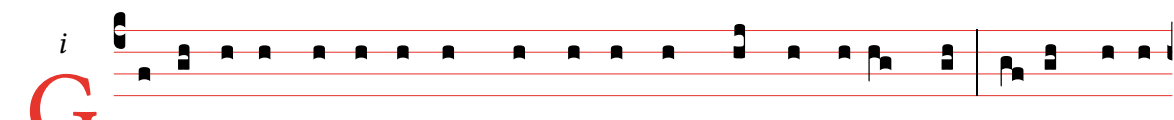
The antiphon may be alternated with one or more of the following verses and a Glory Be.
